*Copilot is back! WRSC uses copilot as a recording system to track attendance, case management and activities.* 

*Everyone can request a swipe card for a \$5.00* replacement fee, (all NEW members are eligible for a card at no cost) or we can train you to navigate the system without one by utilizing our Touch Screen Computer. It is extremely important that each member learns to use this recording system every day to track your daily activities here at the center (even if you are just stopping by to say hi, you will need to put that in copilot). The main reason we use CoPilot is for meal ordering purposes. We don't know you're coming unless you tell us! Pre-Registering for your meal 2 business days in advance helps take away the guess work. Think of it as a Dinner Reservation. By signing up on CoPilot (Pre Registering for your meal), you are committing to showing up for your Lunch. York County Area Agency on Aging is our primary funder and copilot is a more efficient way to show our funders how many people we support on a daily basis. Therefore, it is important that every member tracks their attendance and activities every day! Thank you! While we are just getting back in the building, we will train you and keep it as simple as possible!

Please make sure you are only pre-registering for meals you plan to show up for.

We also ask that you do not come to the center until you know they have been exterminated (this could take a couple of weeks)! If you live in Broad Park Manor, (one of the towers on King St) you can contact Maintenance (717-843-6309) & Penn Pest will come to your home with no cost to you! First they will come to check your home, then schedule a date to treat your home and finally they will come in for a follow up to make sure the treatment worked! Please keep this in mind so we can protect our members & our staff. Bed bugs are not biased pests. You can contract them from <u>ANY WHERE</u>. Such as yard sales, movie theaters, someone else's home and again they are not biased, <u>it can happen to anyone.</u> Thank you for your cooperation!




**Fresh Express** will continue to be distributed at approximately 10:00am. (time subject to change based on delivery time from Central PA Food Bank). We will no longer be loading up your vehicles. You are expected to come inside with your cart/bags/boxes to go through the line (just like we were doing pre-Covid) and have your products handed off to you. You will not go through the line until your table is called up to retrieve your products.

<u>Please note</u>, *JUST BECAUSE YOU ARRIVE FIRST* does <u>NOT</u> mean you will be *served first*. Tables will be called in a **Random Order**. We are serving approximately <u>80</u> individuals, while supplies last. You will not go through the FOOD line until your table is called.

Please remember, we do not provide bags or boxes. Please treat Staff, Volunteers, and other Members with respect. *It is our pleasure to serve you.* 

\*\*\*We have volunteers already lined up so we will ask you if we need help!\*\*\*



Lunch will be served inside by takeout containers. You are welcome to eat inside the building, or take your meal to go. If you are able, we prefer you walk inside to pick up your lunch (but respect if you are unable/or don't feel comfortable doing so). Lunch will be served Monday through Friday, at approximately 11:30. It is your responsibility to Pre-Register for your own meals (We will train you on Co-Pilot and ask that you pre-register at least two business days in advance).

Lunches cannot be held for the following day due to limited refrigerator space. With our *limited* operating hours of 9am-1pm, we are hopeful you will join us inside! Lunch will be served at 11:30 promptly following our Meal Time prayer (please know that this is subject to change based on delivery times from Nutrition Group- our food provider. If you are pre-registered for your lunch, please be here on time. We will call you

to retrieve your lunch by the table you are seated at. \*\*\* Menu is always subject to change based on Nutrition Group\*\*\*

It is the responsibility of each individual to maintain a clean table area. This includes cleaning your table each day after meal time. Work as a team! We appreciate your cooperation. A Cleaning station will be available with paper towels and cleaning supplies. Hand sanitizer will be made available for everyone to sanitize their hands prior to touching the computer monitor/CoPilot Sign in.

As an effort to keep tables CLEAN and CLEAR, the only items that will be permitted to remain on the table at ALL times is your salt and pepper shakers, and your table number. NO OTHER ITEMS WILL BE ALLOWED.


