

# **York County Food Bank**

The Senior Box Program is a federal initiative designed to improve the health and nutrition of income eligible seniors. Seniors receive a box of free food each month, which helps stretch their limited income.

Every month, the Senior Food Box Program provides over 2,000 seniors with a free box of food to help stretch their incomes and improve their nutritional health. Boxes typically include milk, juice, canned meat, poultry, or fish, oats, ready-to-eat cereal, rice, pasta, dry beans, peanut butter, and canned fruits and vegetables.

### Do You Qualify?

Must be 60 or older and living in York County Monthly Income Requirements

- Household of 1: \$1,580
- Household of 2: \$2,137
- \*Must have valid ID

\*If you do not receive your box for (3) months, York County Food Bank will remove you from the list!\*



Individuals who eat their lunch inside will be selected at random to be Senior of the Month. This grants the person selected FIRST for everything, starting at the beginning of the month and run through the end. You will also be highlighted in our newsletter for the following month. A new person will be selected monthly.

### Presidents' Day

### When Is Presidents' Day?

Presidents' Day is observed annually on **the third Monday in February**. In 2024, Presidents' Day will be celebrated on Monday, February 19.

### Presidents' Day History

Historically, Americans began celebrating George Washington's Birthday just months after his death, long before Congress declared it a federal holiday. It was not until 1879, under President Rutherford B. Hayes, that Washington's Birthday became a legal holiday, to be observed on his birthday, February 22.

Washington's birthday was celebrated on February 22 until well into the 20th century. In 1968, Congress passed the Monday Holiday Law to "provide uniform annual observances of certain legal public holidays on Mondays." By creating more 3-day weekends, Congress hoped to "bring substantial benefits to both the spiritual and economic life of the Nation."

Today, Washington's Birthday is one of only 11 permanent holidays established by Congress. One of the great traditions followed for decades has been the reading of Washington's Farewell Address—which remains an annual event for the Senate to this day.

### When Is George Washington's Real Birthday?

Although the federal holiday is held on a Monday (the third Monday of February), Washington's birthday is observed on February 22. To complicate matters, Washington was actually born on February 11 in 1731! How can that be?

Washington was originally born when the Julian calendar was in use. During Washington's lifetime, people in Great Britain and America switched the official calendar system from the Julian to the Gregorian calendar (something that most of Europe had already done in 1582).

As a result of this calendar reform, people born before 1752 were told to add 11 days to their birth dates. Those born between January 1 and March 25, as Washington was, also had to add one year to be in sync with the new calendar.

By the time Washington became president in 1789, he celebrated his birthday on February 22 and listed his year of birth as 1732.

To summarize, Washington's birthday changed from February 11, 1731 (Old-Style Julian calendar), to February 22, 1732 (New-Style Gregorian calendar).

#### Myths About Washington

Legend has it, Washington chopped down a cherry tree when he was 6 years old and, when confronted by his father, said, "I can not tell a lie. I did it with my hatchet."

Well, we can not tell a lie, either. Washington didn't say this; he didn't even chop down the tree! This tale was in fact concocted by Parson Mason Weems (1759–1825), one of Washington's biographers, who made up the story hoping to demonstrate Washington's honesty.

This tale is not the only myth about Washington. His wooden dentures? They weren't made of wood; they were made of hippopotamus teeth that had been filed down to fit into Washington's mouth.

### George Washington Quote

Upon entering office, Washington was not convinced that he was the right man for the job. He wrote, "My movements to the chair of government will be accompanied by feelings not unlike those of a culprit who is going to the place of his execution." Fortunately for the young country, he was wrong.

### Don't Be Left Out in the Cold This Winter

If heating costs are leaving you cold this winter, check out these money-saving programs below to get some warm relief.

The Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) - provides income eligible customers financial assistance to help pay home heating bills and emergency energy assistance to avoid shut-off or to restore service. Call 1-800-

272-2714

Crisis Program - provides a grant to customers who face utility service disruption due to lack of payments or an unsafe utility condition. May be applied to accounts where service has been terminated or for repair of heating equipment. Call 1-800-272-2714

Dollar Energy Fund - provides grants to low-income customers for use in offsetting overdue payments or restoring service to terminated utility accounts. Call 1-800-537-7431

Customer Assistance Program (CAP/PCAP) - offers affordable payment plans and debt forgiveness for customers with low incomes and long-term bill payment problems. Call 1-800-537-7431

WarmWise Low Income Usage Reduction Program - a free home weatherization program which assists customers in reducing their home's natural gas consumption by identifying and remedying areas in the home where heat escapes. Call 1-800-537-7431

Emergency Repair Program - offers financial assistance for the repair or replacement of natural gas furnaces, water heaters, service and house lines, and space heaters serving as the primary heat source for low-income customers who own and are living in their home. Call 1-800-537-7431
