



#### In Memory of John D. Kahler

York - John D. (Jack) Kahler died peacefully January 27, 2022. He was 98. John was a veteran of WWII, an accountant for many years, and, most of all, a family man. He was married to his wife Barbara for 67 years. John was born to Roy and Lillian Kahler in Philadelphia. He lived in several neighborhoods in Philadelphia through his early life as his father, a corner grocer, moved to different locations throughout the city. He graduated from John Bartram High School in January 1942. He was inducted into the U.S. Army, and trained for the Signal Corps at Pennsylvania Military College (PMC), Chester, PA. He was stationed in the European Theater, including France and Belgium, as part of the 95th Infantry Division, operating telephone systems and other technology. His war experience included the Battle of the Bulge. He was honorably discharged in 1945. His older brother, Ross, had been shot down over Belgium, and John returned home to help the family. Beginning a lifelong interest in education, he attended the University of Pennsylvania Wharton School, and received a certificate in Accounting in June 1952. He began his career in accounting working at a West Philadelphia printing company. He met his soon to be wife, Barbara, in Southwest Philadelphia. They were married April 17, 1954. A year later, they moved into their long-time home in Sharon Hill, Delaware County, PA, and, a day later, their first son, John Jr., was born. Their second son, James, joined the family followed by daughter. Janet.

The family was active in many things as the children grew. In 1965, John and Barbara became founding leaders of Sharon Hill 4H Club, where John was a leader for 25 years, teaching skills that he learned in the Signal Corps and helping at 4H camp and fairs. He also served as a member of the Delaware County 4H Council and for a number of years as volunteer auditor. During that time, he returned to the PMC campus, and received a Bachelor's Degree in Accounting in 1969 after the civilian side of the school took the name Penn Morton College. He again returned to the campus, several years later, to begin an MBA at the school, which had changed its name to Widener College He received his Master's in Business Administration in 1979. When Widener became a University the same year, John received a Widener University MBA diploma, giving him a certificate or diploma in all four names of the school. His accounting career changed to healthcare cost accounting during this time, and he worked at Presbyterian Hospital, Philadelphia, before concluding his career as chief cost accountant at Bryn Mawr Hospital, where he was known for his accounting skills. For a time, his son John worked in the hospital's Audio Visual Department, giving father and son a chance to share the daily commute many times. John, Barbara and the family spent many weekends and summers traveling and camping, and for years made a retreat at a trailer at Beechwood Campground in Chester County, where they made long time friends. They were later joined by granddaughters Diana and Danielle, and also enjoyed several trips together as the girls grew. John had a lifelong love of photography.

John and Barbara spent many enjoyable years square dancing in Delaware County and traveled to Square Dance Conventions around the U.S., making friends far and wide. A person of deep faith, John enjoyed singing in the choir at Karmel German Reformed Church (later a UCC congregation) located near his family's Southwest Philadelphia home. He remained a member of the congregation and choir until the congregation closed. He and Barbara began attending Glenolden Congregational Church close to their Sharon Hill home, where John continued in the choir, and both were active in church groups and made craft items for the annual Christmas Festival.

John and Barbara moved to York, PA, in 2012 to live with daughter Janet and son in law John, and enjoyed the new friends they made at White Rose Senior Center, where they continued to be active in crafts, and Canadochly Evangelical & Reformed Church.

John leaves his wife Barbara, son John, Jr. (Carol), daughter Janet Whitehead (John), daughter in law Christine and granddaughters Diana and Danielle, niece Leesa and nephew Brandon. He was preceded in death by father Roy, mother Lillian, brothers Ross and Robert (Margaret), sister Diana, who was called Sissy, and son James. He will be interred at Indiantown Gap National Cemetery. A memorial service is planned for his 100th birthday in 2023.
